165 years of the Adorers' Charism



Stage 1: Looking at Micaela: her Spiritual Journey.

We are celebrating 165 years of the Adorer charism taking as our starting point the motto: "Looking at the origins to revitalize the future".

For this reason, we have focused our reflections on the three thematic lines or stages:

Stage 1: **Looking at Micaela: her spiritual itinerary** that will be developed from July to October 2021.



Stage 2: **Looking at the Congregation: congregational values**, which will take place between November 2021 and February 2022.

Stage 3: **Looking at our present: sense of the consecration and Adorer identity**, which will be held from November 2021 to June 2022.

We are now in the middle of this first stage, which is animated by the communities of the American continent. In each of these phases, the communities in charge are preparing a range of working materials and methodology for this time.

Experience of Preparation for the Pre-Novitiate.

The group of young candidates of the Province of America, who will soon begin our formation in the congregation on the feast of the Easter of our foundress St. Maria Micaela on Wednesday 25th August, want to share with joy and enthusiasm the experience of preparation that we had online this weekend from the 20th to the 22nd of August. The young women Raquel (from Bolivia), Yeraldine (from Colombia), Roxana (from Venezuela) and Isis (from Cuba) who join our sister Sofia (from Argentina) to be companions on our journey.

With the aim of accompanying us to prepare our hearts and be ready to welcome this new formative experience with our formation accompanier who together with the formation team have designed a schedule of work, personal and group reflection. On Friday morning we began with a brief but intense moment of motivation to then enter a workshop of personal acknowledgement, re-discovering the essence of each one of us that makes us recognize ourselves as we are before God, before ourselves and before others. In the afternoon we shared it as a group, taking off our shoes to welcome the sacredness of each one of us and offer it to the Lord in the moments of Adoration and community prayer lived in each community.



Saturday's day was marked by the presentation of the General Plan of Formation designed by the Congregation, particularly focusing on the stage that we will soon begin, as well as the Formation Project of the Prenovitiate of the Province based in Santiago de los Caballeros in the Dominican Republic. Without a doubt, it was a day to soak up the demands and fundamental experiences of this stage as well as the illusion of being able to respond to the call that God calls each one of us by our own name. The preparation was rounded off with a day of retreat. On Sunday we had the opportunity to look at ourselves before Jesus, who, like the two disciples who followed him, asks each one of us personally, "What do you seek? (Jn 1:38). A question that places us once again before our deepest vocational motivations and invites us to follow the Lord, confident in the Love and fidelity of the call he has made to us.

Happy and grateful for all that God has given us these days through our sister Mary Cruz and the fraternal sharing among all of us, we entrust ourselves to your prayers so that like Micaela we may continue to make the gift of the Adorer Charism blossom in each one of us, which the Lord gives us to Love Him, Adore Him and continue to extend a welcoming and liberating hand in community and in the mission that He entrusts to us .





Perpetual Vows of Sr. Lisbeth Silva Alviárez.

In the context of the Jubilee year commemorating 165 years since the founding of the Congregation, our Adorer family is celebrating with immense joy the perpetual vows of our dear Sr. Lisbeth Silva in her Fiat to the fidelity of God the Father; like the psalmist, we sing of the goodness, tenderness and tender mercy of the Lord.

Our hearts are filled with joy; we are immensely grateful that He continues to give us. "God " always surprises us and blesses us with His gifts, envelops us with His grace and covers us with blessings.

We begin the day by praying with a "Vocational Dawn." Several vocational songs are sung with biblical phrases about the call interspersed; at the end Lisbet is invited to recite the psalm "Land of Blessing." The Gospel of the Annunciation (Luke: 1, 26-38) is proclaimed. Finally we give thanks for the wonderful gift of vocation.

At 11 am the Eucharistic Celebration began. She was accompanied by her family, Adorers and lay people from different communities. Sr. Lisbeth Silva Alviárez enters with a lighted candle, a sign of her desire for fidelity to Jesus and his Kingdom, and docility to the Spirit. Rubén Darío Manzano, Passionist priest, presided at the celebration, accompanied by two concelebrants. The Eucharist was animated by a 5-voice mixed choir from Maracay, which was very enjoyable. At the end Lisbeth Silva expressed an emotional thanksgiving to God for her vocation, thanked her blood family who have accompanied her and have been present virtually as well as the Congregational family and friends. The Province of America continues in the key of Shared Mission with a sense of family, understanding that we have to be present in another way. We are open to a human and diverse pedagogy that implies knowing how to listen, understand and welcome the richness that comes from plurality, taking into account the cultural diversity of our Province of America, currently formed by 11 countries, who have participated in the socialization of the Shared Mission Project for this triennium.



From 4 to 18 September, the Provincial area of Shared Mission invited all the communities of the different countries to listen to and get to know the Project called **"SHARED MISSION IN INTERCULTURAL KEY: CHALLENGE AND HOPE FOR OUR PROVINCE OF AMERICA"**. There were 5 virtual meetings in which all the communities responded to the call with enthusiasm, wonder and expectation; we participated with responsibility, new ideas and we glimpsed the need for a project

that would encourage the understanding, development and appropriation of the Shared Mission, as a way of recreating our community life; we highlighted the importance of walking together lay people and sisters towards a new, open and welcoming vision of life, where fraternity, commitment and the joy that our Mission provokes prevails.

This project implies a new style of life and Mission, a commitment to personal, community and provincial revitalization and conversion; a change of perception, of thought and of organization in accordance with the richness that has been given to us in our Charism. Shared Mission in an intercultural key, wants to offer a project of formation and joint action, which allows us to strengthen the sense of Adorer Family, recognising in our differences an opportunity and not an obstacle to share our Mission of Adoration and Liberation.





Celebration of the 15th Anniversary of the Presence of the Religious Adorers in Brazil.

With great joy, as a family, and as a large family that we are, we have just celebrated 15 years of Adorers' presence in Brazil. And we say, "as the large family that we are" because this celebration has brought together sisters and lay people "dispersed" and united from the most diverse places on this planet earth of ours. The Ruah, the Spirit of God, during this difficult situation of pandemic, has awakened us to new forms of



encounter, and the "virtual" is becoming a great opportunity. From the most diverse places where there is an Adorer presence, we have been accompanied in this celebration, uniting through the different means by which the main event was transmitted. We received many messages of affection, encouragement, and gratitude. Thank you for being present in our lives at this special moment. Our sisters of the Province of America made us experience that distances are not an impediment and that, to be a province is to be part of a great community that was present, almost in its entirety, at the celebration and, on behalf of the whole Province, we received a beautiful message from our Provincial Superior, Gabriela Valot, who contextualized the celebration in the context of the celebration of the 165th anniversary of the foundation of the Congregation and encouraged us to look at the past to revitalize the future, which will lead us, in the near future, to begin a new experience in Brazil as a community that tends to itinerancy, to intercongregationality and interculturality, a going to the frontier, material and existential, as the Spirit urges us through Pope Francis. Our sister Carmen Centenera, from heaven, was also present at our celebration, and there were many moments in which her memory was manifested with special strength.

Celebration with the family, distant in space, close in love, but also celebration with those who are now near, and who have helped us so much in the organization, preparation and realization of the main event: parish, pastoral of communication, friends, laity of the Adorer family, religious life in São Luís and many others. It was a precious experience of communion.





We began this festivity on Saturday 25th September, around the Eucharistic table, in which we were able to remember the passage of God through the Adorer charism during these 15 years of presence; we prolonged this celebration by seeing and listening to various testimonies of the experience of the charism in different activities and situations. And we ended this first moment by celebrating with a big anniversary "torta" - "cake" - "bolo". The celebration continued 29 September, the exact date of the arrival of the sisters in Brazil, with a meeting with the lay people who are closest to the community and with whom a process is being carried out so that the charism can continue to bear fruit in these lands of Maranhao. And as the celebrant repeated several times during the Eucharist: "The seed fell on good soil and bore much fruit".

Our Projects



Rahab Project, London.

Sr. Ancy Vaniakizhakkal

In this October's newsletter we are going to get to know the Rahab Project, where exploited and mistreated women are helped through the Adorer Charism with the help of Sr. Ancy Vaniakizhakkal.

Specific objective of this project.

Our mission in London stems from the initial aim of Maria Micaela - Rahab to help women in prostitution and women who have been sexually



exploited, including those who are victims of trafficking and slavery. Our vision is that every woman can experience dignity, justice, and equal opportunity. Rahab offers a safe and welcoming place where they can be themselves, express their fears, joys, and opinions. A place where what they feel is the most important thing of the moment.

Women helping each other and common characteristics that unite them.

Since we started the Rahab UK Project, we have helped over 1,500 women at different levels. But it's not the number, it's the improvement in quality of life we help them to achieve. The common characteristic that first comes to mind is the great capacity they all must confront their situation and fight for a better life. Also, to help each other as they move forward in their own development. Most of them are foreigners with complex legal processes. This, together with the lack of economic resources, the abuse and deception suffered, their feelings of loneliness, separation, stigma, shame..., lack of freedom to improve their situation and achieve autonomy, generates mistrust, low self-esteem, and uneasiness .



Our Projects



Brexit affects the project .

Many of the women we help are suddenly in limbo, irregular, or even illegal, due to lack of settlement status because they do not have the necessary documents to apply, which generates great emotional stress. Many are also unable to visit their families as regularly as they are used to, which is affecting them mentally...

From 'day to night' their situation has made them more vulnerable to possible exploitation and extortion. It is expected that it will be more difficult to access subsidies at European level (which were helpful in the past). In addition, it remains to be seen in which direction the relationships we have built up since we started with organizations across Europe will develop.

Institutional public support.

Rahab does not receive public institutional support directly. For example, the government awarded several grants during 2020 to support charities like ours because of COVID-19. Grants are coordinated through the private sector (e.g. banks, trusts) for different categories and are awarded through multiple and complicated applications.



On a working level, we collaborate with some public bodies such as the police and have opened relationships with nearby municipalities which helps us navigate each other's policies and find common solutions for some of the women we assist (e.g. housing).

Note: it must be acknowledged that, in our experience, it is more complicated to receive grants for prostitution issues than for trafficking and slavery issues which often puts us in second place.



Our Projects



Social environment.

We don't always feel supported by our environment. Times are complicated with so many different causes that people lose a bit of interest. We feel that prostitution is once again in the background and that there is little interest in improving the economic situation that pushes so many women to end up taking this route to support their families. We are concerned that the situation of inequality that is experienced nationally and that was exacerbated by COVID-19 is increasing the numbers of vulnerable women but that little is being done to improve it.

Mother Micaela's spirit and the Adorer charism.

This is embodied in every aspect of our work. From the planning to our structure, to the training of our volunteers, everything has an aspect of the Adorers' charism. For example, when we opened the safe house, 'Micaela Home', we wanted there to be enough space to share experiences as a family, to share a table and conversation. Our style of work follows the principle of 'by her and for her', based on a personal welcome for each woman, creating an atmosphere of trust, listening and personal growth. Starting from the principle of respecting the past and history of each woman, we gain her trust and accompany her on her path towards 'personal freedom'.



Personal reflection.

Welcoming the vulnerability of each woman I have met has helped me to live my vocation as an Adorer. Each woman we meet is an incarnation of God. They have helped me to live my vocation/call more intensely. Each encounter has influenced my life. They have questioned, challenged and influenced my religious commitment to be more authentic. The difference between how little they have and my personal comfort or privileged situation, where I don't have to worry about where tomorrow's bread will come from, only increases my commitment to improve their situation. It has helped me to experience, to approach the contemplative life of Micaela and the need to spend time in the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to consult the situation of the women. When I am weak, I am strong' says St. Paul. In my weakness I find strength in Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.



But as Micaela said: 'Courage, what is there to fear if God is with us?'

Today we interview ...



We interviewed Sonia Guevara Luna, teacher at St. Mother Sacramento School in Malaga.

Sonia Guevara, teacher at St. Madre Sacramento School, a charter school belonging to the Adorers, and she is kind enough to answer some questions for our October Newsletter.

Question. How was the return to school during this time where we are still living with Covid-19?

Answer. We are starting this academic year 21-22 with new enthusiasm as we are able to return to being present at all stages, which is a fundamental aspect of our educational work. It is true that we still have some restrictions and although vaccinations give us a break, we must continue to rely on the three fundamental pillars to prevent covid in schools: hand gel, masks and ventilation. However, compared to last year, we feel that we are getting closer to normality, which is very necessary for our daily work and which helps us to take better care of the educational, emotional, social and spiritual needs of our students.



Q. Are the pastoral and extracurricular activities that had to be suspended last year going to be resumed during this academic year?

A. We continue to adapt the pastoral ministry to the circumstances we are living through of restrictions, uncertainty and the sorrow of so many families in our surroundings. The pastoral teams of the centres have made a great effort to be able to look after our most precious gift, to continue evangelising, especially in all that we are experiencing. I know that in these circumstances our Adorers' educational centres have been able to generate and create new means to reach out to the students despite the restrictions experienced, through social networks, small group activities, more reflective and supportive activities, accompanying the situations of illness and loss that have occurred in our educational community.

Pastoral care is much more than carrying out specific activities. Everything we have experienced makes us realise that now is a special time for us to show what we are capable of as Christian centres, to take care of our being, caring for people and renewing our commitment to children, young people and their families. It is a time to accompany all that they have experienced and continue to experience, the emotions, the pain, the loss, the illness, the complex work situations.... In short, to take care of the small details of their lives in order to continue generating hope and promoting the experience of the encounter with Jesus. And of course, taking up everything that helps us to continue evangelizing without forgetting that our educational centres still have restrictions.



Today we interview ...



Q. From your point of view, what does Catholic Subsidised Education offer students that Public Education does not offer?

Mainly, it offers a Gospel-style education that is humanising, where the main focus is on the person and the search for his or her integral development. This entails an ideology, common goals and an identity that makes our educational style a space of encounter, depth, closeness and solidarity that helps to prepare children and young people so that they can leave our centres with an adequate integral formation and face the new challenges of our world, our common home.

A. ¿How is the spirit of Santa María Micaela reflected in the school's mission statement?

Our school is mainly a professional training centre, so it has special characteristics and the students are usually with us for an average of two years, which is a great challenge for us to carry out our ideology. This means that we have to show who we are from the very first day. So the first days of the school year are dedicated to welcoming new students and working on the annual motto, like other schools. Another strong pillar is the work of the teaching staff, for which we train them to transmit in individual and group tutorials a professional style but at the same time the closeness and familiarity typical of our Adorers' centres. In a special way, we usually carry out an annual Micaelian Triduum, now in its 13th year, where we show the life of St. Maria Micaela, her values and the style of the Adorers. It is usually welcomed every year with great success of attendance by our students and their families, which makes us continue to be aware of the validity of the Adorer charism today, a gift and a blessing. And many small actions such as prayer/reflection every morning, celebrations at important liturgical moments, gestures, occasional workshops... which help us to impregnate our centre with the Adorer charism.

Q. And how do you transmit it to the students?

Answer. We try to transmit it with the passion of feeling that we are Adorer educators, trying to take care of the language in order to reach the young people and the adults who study in our centre, surprising them in order to break with the schemas that they sometimes bring with them, listening to them and making them participants and protagonists of what we organize, getting close to their realities and their preferences so as to be able to transmit the message of our founder. We take great care of the social networks which is a place where we believe we must be present to reach young people...in short, we are constantly changing and searching without losing our identity as an Adorer centre.




Sr. Micaela Tanigaichi .


