

Abstract: The EAPN-Andalusia report points out that 40% of the people of Granada are at risk of child poverty and in certain localities such as Fuente Vaqueros or Pinos Puente, child poverty rates reach 65 and 68%. They also highlight the increase in female unemployment in Granada - the second highest in Andalusia after Huelva - with 29.89% compared to 24% in 2019. The data were presented today at an event in which the Amaranta Solidarity Foundation delegation of Granada participated along with other entities of the Andalusian Network for the Fight Against Poverty and Social Exclusion.

Abstract: We kicked off the week with the training given last Saturday in coalition with @portimujer.ongd and @redlatinasydelcaribe. Iskra Orillo, head of the Health area of Proyecto Esperanza closed the Course for Community Promoters for Equality and Prevention of Violence in the Valencian Community, organized by @portimujer.ongd. The aim of the course is to provide the participating women with tools that enable them to detect gender-based violence, as well as to offer support, information and accompaniment to those women who suffer it, in order to be at their side and facilitate their process of autonomy. In her closing presentation, Iskra spoke about trafficking in women for sexual and other exploitative purposes (including trafficking for labour exploitation, forced marriages and criminal activities), and its impact on the comprehensive health of victims and survivors, as well as their right to comprehensive care for their recovery. 

Abstract: Maintaining close contact with the State Security Forces is a task that we have maintained active since 1999, both in intervention and assistance to victims and in specialized training. This is what we did yesterday with the participation of our Awareness Coordinator, Marta González, in the XXXI Course for Promotion to the rank of Commissioner of the National Police in the afternoon, in the Round Table "Assistance to Victims of Illegal Immigration Networks". We had the opportunity to present our residential resource and services including the detection and identification department. We recalled the obligations that the State has towards victims, as well as their rights and we were able to emphasize the importance of having an intersectional, human rights and gender perspective that can guarantee effective protection. We also expressed our concern about the impact of COVID 19 on victims in situations of exploitation, as there is an increase in vulnerability and lack of protection.

Thank you for your committed and quality social journalism as you are a very important and key agent to make human trafficking visible. It is important to work so that victims do not run the risk of being manipulated. Our awareness-raising coordinator Marta González points out that: Regarding the identification process, the most important thing is to "attend to the needs, well-being and rights of the victims". In addition, it is important to avoid "that they are not re-victimized by the way they are treated, by not identifying them properly, by instrumentalizing them, by not respecting their rights or their needs".
