
Dear Sisters

Advent finds all of us who are part of this great Adorer family "looking at our origins to revitalise our future.



As our Congregation celebrates the 165th year of its foundation, we the Indian provinces have a twin reasons to thank the Lord for His continuous graces and blessings. Because on November 14, 1947 our pioneers of the Indian foundation of Sisters Adorers Mother Antonia Mene, Sr Jovita Fernandez Gabanes, Sr Maria Luz Martinez Caballero and Sr Adelaida Romero Amillano, from Spain landed in India, we humbly thank the gift of each one of them who toiled to place a tabernacle for the Lord among our Hindu brethren.



As we enter in to the 75th year of our presence in India, the Indian provinces gratefully acknowledge the Lord's Mighty Hands that led our Pioneer Sisters who journeyed through thick and thin of life with determined spirit and courage. May their noble souls rest in peace .

The tiny seed which they planted in Puri, Orissa has today grown in to a huge tree that spread out in India and its neighbouring countries. Owing to distance and easy administrative purpose the Province of India bifurcated in to two Provinces in the year 2000 as Province of Kolkata and Mumbai. Today they have 14 and 12 houses respectively with their presence in one foreign country each - Nepal and Philippines.





Our first Tabernacle of India.

Like Micaela, we believe that “liberation is possible”. Embracing their human frailty and encouraging their process of self-discovery that leads to healing, inner freedom, personal growth and wholeness, we advocate the promotion and social re-integration of women and girls, exploited by prostitution and various forms of social evils.

In this 75th year of the presence of the Congregation in the Indian soil, both provinces are getting ready to celebrate it meaningfully. The Kolkata province is already in it by organising chain adorations for the entire year by all our houses, on

line monthly recollections in turn by each house, reading and reflecting on Congregational documents, praying rosaries at the same time by the whole province with particular intentions and making use of the modern media for the propagation of the Charism etc.



We pray that as we celebrate the platinum jubilee may the Lord of the harvest bless our Congregation with more genuine vocations, thus Micaela can continue living through Adores who are yet to come.

Hereby we invite the entire Congregation to join with us to thank the Lord for his steadfast love and mercy especially towards the Indian provinces for the past 75 years .





Meeting of the Talitha Kum Coordination Team.

For the first time since the beginning of the pandemic, the team of international coordinators Talitha Kum met, in person, in Rome to plan the future projects of their international network against human trafficking.

Talitha Kum is the International Network of Consecrated Life against the Trafficking of Persons, present in 5 continents and made up of 50 national inter-congregational networks that coordinate their efforts against trafficking at national-local level.

Call to Action.

Today, 25th November, International Day for the Elimination of Gender Violence, we participated in the presentation of the "Call to Action" of the International Network of Consecrated Life against Trafficking - Talitha Kum, in Rome.

A call to action to care for, heal, empower and restore..... in short, to continue to accompany so many people who suffer violence, exploitation, victims of unjust and unequal social systems.



This call to action draws the attention of stakeholders and international governance to four fundamental axes:

- Ensuring access to justice and to long-term psychosocial and health care, as well as work and residence permits for victims of trafficking in destination countries;
- Empowering women and girls, as well as their families and communities;
- Supporting safe and legal migration pathways, including in cases of forced displacement;
- Promoting an economy of care and solidarity.

All of us, strengthened by the Word of God, are called to collaborate.

The Eucharist, Source of Adorer Spirituality.

The process of formation of lay Adorers continues, despite the pandemic situation; last November 20, the "Seed" group, formed by a team of lay Adorers, who have been following and serving Jesus Eucharist, from the Adorer charism, we reflected on this adventure, which is the belonging to the Adorer family; an adventure that is "lived from a Eucharistic spirituality" and whose identity is deeply marked by the charism that reflects the experience of St. Maria Micaela.



We deepen the charismatic aspects rooted in the Eucharist: communion and love, in the sense that the experience of St. Maria Micaela moves us to "be friends of Jesus and share his mission of Liberation": our Mission is in reality a great relationship of friendship that has its genesis in the call of God to a consecrated and lay life, in a profound relationship of love with Jesus, conveyed to the women who cry out for their freedom.

The Eucharistic experience of our Saint invites us to live the Eucharist in the style of Jesus, in an experience of communion, in an experience of love between sisters and laity in such a way that we can respond to the challenge of being bread broken and given to "them", who need to be liberated with the love and the apostolic, missionary sense that only flows from the Eucharist.

This formation experience has raised several questions that lead us to personal and community discernment: How are we living the community dimension of the Eucharist? Does our community life respond to a common table shared by sisters and laity? Does our experience of adoration renew the liberating presence of Jesus? ... There are many more questions that are still inside us, sisters, and laity; they surely move us to reflect on the community, apostolic and liberating commitment that we have with Jesus.

Finally, we believe that the Passion of St. Maria Micaela for the Eucharist is the door always open to our spirituality of adoration .





Together on the Way: the intercultural challenge in life and mission.

In response to the commitment made at the VIII General Conference, "to promote formation processes in the key of interculturality as a path of spirituality for Adorer life and mission", a seminar on INTERCULTURALITY was held on November 22-23-24, organized by the Formation Area of the General Team and accompanied by Fr. Tim Norton, svd., a reference in this area who not only transmits theory, but does so by sharing his great experience of intercultural life.

In these days we have been offered a very general vision that opens horizons, perspectives, clues to live and understand the different, to value one's own culture and that of others...a desire to continue learning and reflecting. Later on, we will have other meetings with more concrete themes that will give us tools to make our own path and intercultural process.



Our Projects



AFJ Home, Paris.

On each of the Sundays of Advent we are going to approach an Adorers' project. We begin with the AFJ Home project .

History.

The "Foyer AFJ" was created in 1967 with the aim of welcoming new arrivals in Paris and offering them stable accommodation, trying to prevent them from resorting to prostitution in order to survive.

The role of the AFJ Home is marked by the fact that it is the only home in France founded for the protection of trafficked women. The specific objectives of the AFJ Home are:



- To welcome and protect victims of trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation.
- To offer comprehensive support to promote the autonomy of the persons hosted.
- To train and raise awareness in the care of victims of trafficking.

This care for victims of trafficking is based on the following principles:

- Respect for the person, their rights, their private life, their culture and beliefs.
- Support and individualized attention to the victim.
- Promotion of the path and the experience of the women welcomed towards autonomy.
- Commitment against human trafficking at national and international level.
- Solidarity with projects to help women and minors in a situation or at risk of exploitation.



Our Projects



In 2000, at the initiative of the Congregation of the Adorers, the first victims of trafficking arrived at the project, so that in 2005, women victims of this drama occupied the 12 places available.

In 2007, AFJ became more professional with the arrival of a social worker and a psychologist. Subsequently, the psychosocial team was completed with the recruitment of a monitor-educator in 2010.

In 2012/2013, they began to count on the help of the Amaranta Solidarity Foundation (FSA), which supports and coordinates the social program founded by the Congregation of the Adorers throughout the world. Thanks to its supervision, AFJ is evolving towards full supervision.




Our Projects



Admission Criteria

The AFJ Home has 12 places, distributed in double and single rooms. The admission criteria are as follows:

- Be an adult woman without children victim of human trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation.
- Identified as a victim of trafficking or potential victim in the context of the assessment (identification of the victim by the police is not a necessary criteria).
- Need for shelter from the danger of violence, threats and pressure from the exploitation network.
- Asking for help to escape from a network and get out of the situation of prostitution.
- Accepting the conditions of care and safety standards so as not to put the group of women in the shelter at risk.
- It is not necessary to report a trafficking network to the police to gain access to the Home.



Our Projects



Accompanying the victims

Who is welcomed?

The AFJ Home welcomes adult women without children who are victims of trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation and who require shelter. Exceptionally and depending on the places available, we also welcome women whose situation requires emergency accommodation (domestic violence, domestic violence, etc.).



At Hogar AFJ we work with 4 program that depend on the objectives established between the Home and the woman.

Short term. The victim is sheltered for 1 or 2 days while legal procedures are resolved with the help of lawyers or the police.

Medium term. In this program, the woman is prepared for her return to her country. However, this requires time to secure the person's situation and to carry out a risk assessment (family investigation, social investigation, investigations to find out if the person has been identified as a victim in the country of origin...).

Long-term: Long-term care, from 3 months to 3 years. This is comprehensive and personalized care where the concepts of protection and safety are central. The intervention of the multidisciplinary team as well as the use of external services are essential to promote administrative procedures and regularization.

Support without accommodation. In this case, it refers to women who have left the home but maintain a link with the team: social support, help with regularization, therapeutic support or to maintain emotional ties with the home by regularly visiting it, participating in collective events.

Training activities

The trainings are carried out by the project manager, the psychologist's office and professionals who are in contact with persons identified or likely to be victims of trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation. The theoretical and practical aspects of the training interventions are adapted to the needs of the professionals and teams

MONOGRAPHIC 25N: INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN.


On the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, we are publishing a monographic resource that aims to be another tool to delve deeper into this drama.

-  In the first week of December, she will participate online in a formation workshop for JPIC animators programmed by the UISG .



 She is in Spain for the Spiritual Exercises and other activities. She will return to Rome on 21 December.


